Mansch Finds his Way Back to Victory Lane at Hickory Motor Speedway

The drivers of the NASCAR
Whelen All-American Series
certainly didn't disappoint as the
Bojangles Late Models, the
Advance Auto Parts Limiteds, the
Everything Attachment Super
Trucks, the Hickory Street Stocks
and the Hickory 4-Cylinders took
to the track for some intense and
action packed racing. The night
began with the Hickory Motor
Speedway Fan Experience, with



the No. 92 of Bojangles Late Model driver, Candace Muzny giving fans a full speed ride around the track in a real late model stock car. The night came to a close with flames from a special appearance by the Green Mamba Jet Car, with operator Doug Rose melting down a car on the infield of the track.

The Bojangles Late Models pulled onto the asphalt in full force for their 50 lap feature event, with the No. 88 of Kyle Mansch leading the pack to the green flag. On lap three the No. 7 of Ashley Huffman pulled under the No. 5 of Dexter Canipe Jr. for the second place position. Coming out of turn four, on lap seven, the No. 43 of Jesse LeFevers took it three wide with Huffman and Canipe Jr. The three drivers traveled three wide until Huffman was forced to back off to avoid being run up into the outside wall. The first caution flew on lap 29 when the No. 92 of Candace Muzny got into the back of the No. 28 of Chris Chapman. At the restart the No. 51 of Josh Wimbish flew into the second place position, leaving LeFevers and Canipe Jr. to battle for third. LeFevers and Canipe Jr. raced door-to-door until lap 32 when Canipe Jr. got loose coming out of turn two, allowing LeFever to settle into third and the No. 2 of Jason Romero to move around him and take over the fourth, pushing Canipe Jr. into fifth.

The No. 10 of Andy Mercer spent the first portion of the race patiently working his way into the top five, taking over fifth place from Canipe Jr. on lap 37. The second caution fell on lap 44 after Romero got loose coming off of turn three, causing his ride to go for a spin heading into turn four. Muzny also went for a spin heading into turn four, as she tried to avoid Romero. With five laps to go Mercer had secured the third place position, pushing LeFevers back to fourth. Romero and the No. 3 of Jessica Brunnelli went for a spin heading into turn one, bringing out the third caution on lap 48. The fourth and final caution fell during the restart after the No. 95 of Michael Buckner got into the No. 15 of Chazz Anderson heading out of turn two, sending Anderson spinning. It was an intense final lap as Huffman shot to the outside line sliding past Canipe Jr. to grab a top five finishing position. Mansch, Wimbish, LeFevers, Mercer and Huffman made up the top five

respectively.



The action during the Advance Auto Parts Limiteds race started quickly after the No. 5 of points leader Dexter Canipe Jr. pulled into the lead on the first lap, taking over the spot from the No. 35 of pole sitter Chris Lewis. The first caution waved on lap ten after the No. 15 of Sheflon Clay and the No. 37 of Landon Huffman made contact in turn two sending Huffman for a spin. A second caution fell on lap 15 after the No. 66 of Travis Byrd went for a spin in turn two. During the restart a third caution was called for debris on the track. The No. 07 of Tyler Church was on the move, as he worked his way into second place on lap 17. A fourth caution waved on lap 26 after the No. 97 of Brandon Lynn went for a spin heading into turn four. The fifth and final caution came out on lap 28 when the No. 24 of Anthony Flannery and Lynn connected headed into turn one, sending Flannery for a spin and Lynn into the outside wall. The battle for second was intense

during the final lap. Church, Lewis and the No. 12 of Austin McDaniel went three wide coming out of turn four to cross the finish line only inches apart. Canipe Jr. brought the field to the checkers with Church, Lewis, McDaniel and the No. 69 of John Hilliker in tow to round out the top five.

The Everything Attachment Super Trucks put on an exciting show during their 35 lap race. The No. 33 of Jeremy Birch was quick to work towards the front after moving into the third place position within the first five laps. On lap eight, the No. 7 of Just Crider drove up alongside Birch looking to regain the third place position, taking back the spot on lap 20. The first and only caution fell on lap 22 after the No. 15 of James Kirkham and Birch went for a spin in turn four. With five laps remaining the No. 16 of pole sitter, Clint Fields continued to increase his lead over the field, while Crider stayed tight to the bumper of the No. 11 of Thomas Beane looking for a chance to move into second. On the final lap Crider was finally able to pull under Beane as they came off of turn four. Beane put up a fight and was able to hold off Crider as they came to the finish line, coming home second to Fields, leaving Crider to finish third. The No. 05 of Kyle Wilson and the No. 6 of Brandon Sezter completed the top five.



The competition during the Hickory Street Stock 30 lap event was intense with several battles for position throughout the race. On lap three the No. 9 of Charlie Watson, the No. 64 of Marshall Sutton and the No. 03 of Kevin Eby entered into a heated battle for third, with Eby capturing the position on lap six, leaving Watson and Sutton to compete for fourth. On lap eight, Sutton drove under Watson to take over fourth, but Watson kept his eye on Sutton being sure that he didn't get too far away. On lap ten Watson had pulled back up on Sutton and the two continued to inch ahead of one another trading the position back and forth, until lap 15 when Sutton secured the fourth place spot.



With five laps to go, the No. 1 of Taylor Stricklin began to reel in the No. 21 of pole sitter Roger Pitts. The first and only caution of the event fell on the final lap after Pitts got loose coming out of turn two as he headed down the back stretch. Just as Pitts and Stricklin headed into turn three, Pitts' ride spun around bringing out the caution, causing a green-white-checkered finish, with Stricklin in the lead. There was a tight battle for second on the final lap as Eby, Stutton, and Pitts come out of turn four running three wide, to finish second through fourth. Watson secured a fifth place finish.



The Hickory 4-Cylinders put on a relatively tame race in comparison to their fellow divisions, as they took on the historic short track for a 25 lap event. The first and only caution came out on the first lap after the No. 52 of Michael Issacs and the No. 22 of Dan Moore went for a spin as they entered turn four. The No. 4 of pole sitter Adam Beaver had led the field around the track for the entire 25 lap event, using lap traffic as a pick to grow his lead over the field by lap ten. The No. 16 of Randy Freeze kept close tabs on Beaver as he looked for any chance to get around Beaver for the lead. Beaver ran a strong race, bringing the field to the checkers leaving Freeze, the No. 17 of Curtis Pardue, the No. 09 of Randy Canipe and the No. 59 of Donn Wardo to make up the top five.
